A late twelfth- or early thirteenth-century binding from Fountains Abbey.

'Liber Ezechialis'. MS. on vellum (Latin), written at Fountains Abbey, Yorkshire, in the latter part of the twelfth century; ruled.

White whittawed skin over wooden boards. A brass clasp on a long leather thong fastens almost in the centre of the lower cover. The flat spine has at head and tail semi-circular tabs whipped round with blue silk. Vellum paste-downs.




